Yes. Currently, SABPA is accepting donations towards the Coronavirus Outbreak Relief Fund. SABPA is partnering with ACCEF to purchase critical medical supplies to be shipped to the areas hit hardest by the coronavirus outbreak with your donations.

2. How do I make donations through SABPA?
